Later, around 12:30, event openers and speakers took over the stage. After that, many performances were showcased from each culture in its unique style.

The Howard County Chinese School danced and played the Waist drum yangko (腰鼓秧歌). They dressed in a bright green shirt, red pants, and a golden belt. The Howard County Chinese School had a tent for others to visit and showcase the Chinese curriculum.

River Hill's parade tradition began in 2001 and has continued to grow in popularity over the years. The parade starts at 9 am at Pointers Run Elementary School and ends at the Fifth District Volunteer Fire Department. Organized by the Student Government Association (SGA) of Howard County Chinese School, our parade team proudly continues a tradition that began in 2017.

Around 9:15 AM, the Chinese School's pickup truck drove along the path with spectators cheering. A Drummer dressed in striking red robes performed atop a decorated truck, delivering powerful beats that echoed through the streets. Kids followed to throw candy to the audience watching the parade. Following the truck, flag holders carried the HCCS banner, people danced with Chinese fans, and a waist drum performance team was present. In an interview, a member of the drumming group explained that, four weeks leading up to the parade, the HCCS drum group met three times

each week, logging roughly fifteen practice rounds per session. Their disciplined rehearsals ensured that the parade went smoothly.

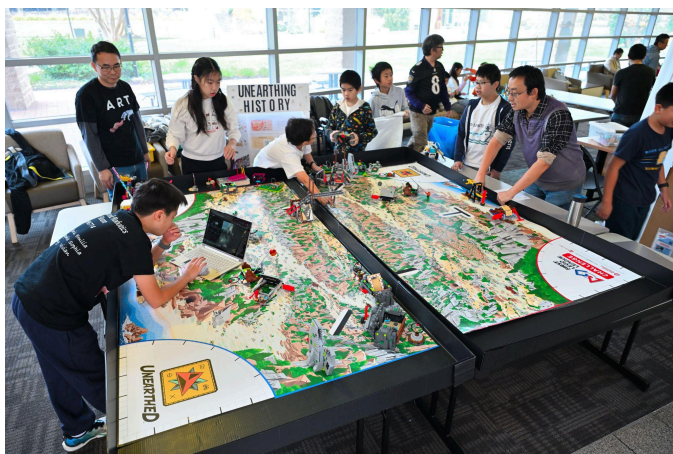
